FUEL CRISIS

How is the national fuel crisis affecting Wiltshire & our Business Community?

In July London recorded the highest petrol prices we've seen in a long while at 120.3p for unleaded petrol and in Scotland they recorded a high price of 133.7p for diesel. This puts the UK as the 9th highest unleaded petrol retailer and the 2nd highest diesel retailer in Europe.

The high fuel costs were felt all over the country and certainly in Wiltshire there were long queues at the petrol stations. The current national average is now 114.1p for petrol and 126.3p for diesel, in Salisbury, Waitrose is now selling unleaded at 113.9p and diesel at 124.9p. Supermarket prices have started to reduce down due to the price wars between themselves. Morrison's lead the cuts currently with others following suite.

Interestingly if a litre of unleaded petrol costs 115p then the price is broken down like this; 10.17p to the retailer, 17.13p goes to the VAT, 37.35p goes back on the product and 50.35p is on Duty.

Wessex Fleet and Innotec have supplied us with an insight of what is happening on a local level.



"Salisbury drivers are mirroring the trend nationwide with a move from larger vehicles to smaller and more efficient modes of transport. Our customer's requests for 4x4 and other large engine, low MPG cars has virtually stopped, with awareness on CO2 emissions and vehicle MPG is now at the forefront of most decisions made.

Fuel prices in Salisbury topped £1.34/litre, but the Government was forced to postpone the planned 2p rise in fuel duty in the Autumn and coupled with the price of oil now actually dropping, it would seem at least to point to a period of relative stability after a period of almost daily fuel price increases.

*So what needs to be done? Salisbury business drivers need to cut out un-necessary business miles and drive the most efficient cars available. By doing this, manufacturers will respond to demand (as well as legislation) and focus on further developing the technologies that will lead to less of a reliance on crude oil." **Tim McNally – Wessex Fleet Solutions - 01722 322888***

"The global economy faces a long term problem rather than a short term crisis, and events over recent months are just a small indication of what lies ahead, unless we act together exploring and supporting both physical and practical methods to reduce our energy consumption. The International Energy Agency predicts a rise in global energy demand of 50-60% by 2030 against conventional fossil fuels diminishing resources. The net result is a conservative prediction of a 30% global shortfall of energy to sustain our economies and businesses.



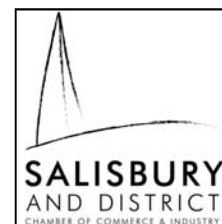
At Innotec we have implemented a number of activities to reduce our energy consumption, including the implementation of new more fuel efficient vehicles and we are now examining how these vehicles can be converted to run on recycled fuel sources. We are encouraging our customers to use our ecommerce facilities as well allowing us to consolidate our deliveries."

As both companies suggest we need to act on an individual level to help cut costs for our businesses. If your workforce is driving a company car perhaps some simple guidelines will help cut down the fuel bills! We are being told to stay off the road in peak times to avoid sitting in queues of traffic, obey speed regulations, cut out shorter trips and walk, reverse park so you can drive a cold engine forward—this saves fuel, check your tyre pressure and did you know driving with the window open causes drag giving the vehicle less fuel efficiency!

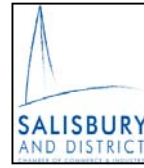

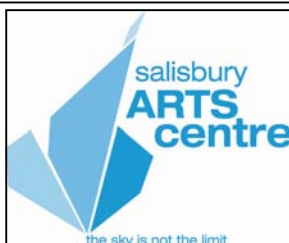


ALABARÉ NEWS

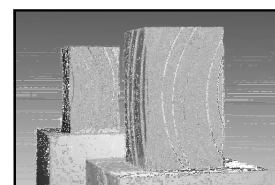

LOCAL PLUMBER BECOMES A 'FILMSTAR' TO SHOW OFF ECO HEATING!

Amesbury-based plumber Jonathan Ayres is set to become a 'film star' after appearing on camera for promotional and training videos for Ecodan the low carbon heating system from Mitsubishi Electric.

The filming took place at a new eight-property development in Shrewton near Salisbury and saw Jonathan, Managing Director of Ayres Heating & Plumbing being interviewed alongside the revolutionary new way of heating a home. Ecodan, which Ayres Heating fitted to the outside of all eight houses at the development, uses an air source heat pump to harvest natural energy in the air and upgrade it to heat the water supply.

"I was happy to do the filming as I think these heat pump systems are a great way of reducing both household bills and carbon emissions," explained Jonathan. "They are straightforward to install and are a lot less to buy than ground source heat pump systems."

Jonathan is also convinced that the easy installation will lead to substantial interest in air source heat pumps, especially when people realise that the average UK household currently produce over 5 tonnes of CO₂ per year and water heating accounts for more than 73 per cent. However, he doesn't see the filming leading to any calls from Hollywood, although the promotional film should eventually be available on the Internet.
